Dr. DiLorenzo received his degree in Agricultural Engineering from the Universidad Nacional de La Plata, Argentina, in 2002. He moved to the U.S. to pursue graduate studies at the University of Minnesota, where he obtained his MS (2004) and PhD (2008), both in Animal Sciences, emphasis in beef cattle nutrition. From 2008 to 2010, Dr. DiLorenzo worked as a postdoctoral Research Associate at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, TX, conducting research in feedlot nutrition and management. In 2010, he joined the University of Florida as an Assistant Professor in Animal Sciences at the NFREC in Marianna. His primary research and extension interests are in beef cattle nutrition, with the objective of improving the efficiency of use of forages minimizing the environmental impact. His research focuses on ruminal metabolism and fermentation, emissions of greenhouse gases, and nutrient excretion in cattle systems.
